## Flowering Pollinator Seed Distribution Spreading Our Message

Bees, butterflies, and hummingbirds play an important role in sustaining healthy ecosystems. and pollinating many of our fruits, nuts and vegetables. Join the VTC Environmental Institute in our efforts to enhance pollinator populations by planting season-long pollen and nectar sources.

Mix includes: Virginia
Native Perennials: Purple
Coneflower, New
England Aster, BlackEyed Susan, Lanceleaf
Coreopsis, Columbine,
Hyssops (Agastache
foeniclum), and
Milkweed (Asclepias
tuberosa); Self-Seeding
Annuals: Cosmos and
Zinnia

We are custom making 25,000 seed packets of pollinator plants which we intend to distribute to members of the General Assembly and key local leaders along with flyers about our industry.



Seed packets will be offered to our members, Virginia's General Assembly, local leaders, and environmental groups. Our seed packets contain plants that provide color and attract pollinators all season. Dr. Cindy Smith of George Mason University selected the mix of Virginia native perennials and self seeding annuals. The plants, their flowers, and the pollinators they attract will be our ambassadors throughout the season.

Jeff Fedorchak who is TruGreen's Vice President for Corporate Affairs and a member of our Government Affairs Committee and past member of our Development Commiteee made these seed packets possible.
